Walt Morrison, who had qualified in the top twelve and ran in the second Heat Race, had some mechanical problems and could not compete thereafter. Thus, the nineteenth qualifier, Gerald Swayze, in #24, moved up and replaced Mitchem in the Medallion Race. Consequently, when all was said and done, nineteen of the twenty-seven participating aircraft (one aircraft was qualified by two different pilots, thus the reasons for twenty-eight qualifying positions) got to race. Qualifiers #20, #21, #23, #24, #25, #26. #27 and #28 did not make the field and qualifier #22 was, as previously stated, an alternate pilot who did not compete.
